Prof. Nick Glozier is a consultant psychiatrist specialising in epidemiology, trials and health services research. He has a research interests in public mental health, function, sleep, the workplace, stress, disability and discrimination in our changing psychosocial and technological environments. In thirteen years since arriving in Australia he has been awarded in nationally competitive grants as a Chief Investigator, and is a theme leader in the new ARC Life Course Centre of Excellence

Clinically he is consultant in the Local Health District Community Team and has established a clinical trials unit at the PMBC. This unit focusses on interventions for chronic mood and sleep conditions with NHMRC, industry, health and International funders

In the late 1990's Prof Glozier worked at the World Health Organisation and is an author of the WHO's Disability Classification system, the ICF, sister to the ICD-10 diagnostic system and the WHO Disablement Assessment Schedule (WHODAS -II). He has a number of international projects with collaborators in LIMCs and Europe

His team are commissioned by NGOs, industry, and government to produce policy relevant end user driven research and program evaluations
